Teen Advisory Board

Members meet monthly during the school year to suggest, discuss, and help plan our teen programs at the library. TAB is a great place to gain leadership experience for National Honor Society, scholarships, college applications, and future resumes! Opportunities for leadership positions are plentiful. Membership is open to teens in grades 6 through 12. Perks include free printing and fine amnesty for active members.

Teen Tech Tutors

Do you love technology? Our Teen Tech Tutors help adults with their technology questions every Tuesday after school. Earn community service hours by giving one-on-one lessons to adults who need help with iPads, Kindles, smartphones, and more.



Book Hipsters

Book Hipsters gather weekly to discuss anything they have read. Teen readers get to recommend books to their peers by writing reviews, recommendations, and top ten lists. Community service hours are earned for written reviews and other content created for the Library's Teen Blog and newsletter.
