**Thurs., July 23 at 6:00pm**

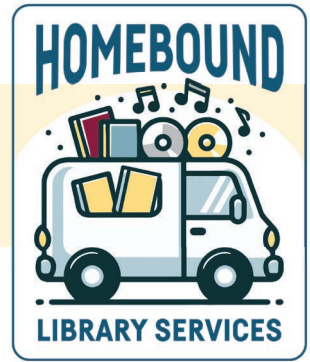
